# Safe and Caring:

#### **Cold Weather Protocol:**

Upon our return from the Christmas Break, we are expected to see a change in the weather with very cold temperatures. We wanted to remind parents surrounding our cold weather protocol. For colder days when school is in session, where the temperature is colder than <a href="#color: blue;">-20 Degrees Celsius, including the wind chill and humidex factor as per Environment Canada, the following will occur:</a>

- When students are arriving to school, they are to be let into the school as soon as they arrive—they will wait in the boot rooms. All supervisors will be at their boot rooms and can let students into the boot room, but students are kept them out of the hallways.
- Outdoor recesses with become indoor breaks. Students can go to any of the non-outdoor activities, but are not

- roaming the halls. Outdoor supervisors will be re-deployed.
- Any Curricular activities that are scheduled to be conducted outside (e.g. Physical Education, Outdoor education, etc), will need to be adapted or changed and conducted indoors.
- The decision to determine if it will be an indoor recess will be made at the same time and announced over the intercom to inform faculty prior to the arrival of the students in the morning.
- The temperature will be assessed over the course of the school day if it is increasing to determine if it will be an indoor or outdoor recess for lunch. The announcements will be made over the intercom if there is a change from the morning announcements.

#### **Confidentiality:**

As an administration team, we are working to establish effective communication between the school and parents. When we contact parents to advise them of any incidents that involve their child and other students, many parents will inquire about the consequence(s) that is/are issued to the other student(s).

As an administration team, we believe that this is a natural question that any parent would ask. #### **Field Trips and Refunds:**

In the past, we have had some parents request a refund because a child is absent or he/she no longer wishes to take part in a field trip. In the past there was a range of practices that have been done in relation to this. As of last year, we are only able to process a refund in the event a parent/child changes their mind to go on a field trip only up to the date the money and consent forms are due. After that time, no refunds can be issued. When charging a fee for a field trip, we do so on a 'cost recovery basis.' When we book these trips and factor in things like transportation costs and numbers have to be confirmed in advance with the venue, we end up being in a situation where the school loses money on the field trip. For example, if a field trip is scheduled on December 12th and money and consent forms need to be in on December 5th, we can only issue a refund no later than December 5th.

## **Continuous Improvement:**

#### **Accountability Pillar Surveys:**

When we return after the Christmas break, As an annual check-up on the education system, the Accountability Pillar provides an opportunity for Alberta Education and school authorities to ensure that we are equipping students for success.

The Accountability Pillar uses a set of 16 indicators. Data on these indicators consists of surveys of students, parents and teachers on various aspects of education quality, student outcomes such as dropout and high school completion rates, and provincial assessments of student learning.

From January to the end of February, Alberta Education will be conducting the annual Accountability Pillar Survey. In January, parents of students in grades 7 will receive a survey from Alberta Education. In February, students in grades 7 and all teachers will be completing their surveys online at school.

All surveys are anonymous and ask questions about experiences with your school. In addition to English and French, the parent survey is available in Chinese, Punjabi, Arabic, Blackfoot, Dene, Cree, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog and Urdu.

Your participation in the survey helps provide important information on the quality of education your child is receiving,

so we encourage you to return your survey promptly. Survey results will be available to school authorities in May 2018, and will be reported publicly as part of their 3-Year Education Plans and Annual Education Results Reports. This data assists our school with our planning.

We will be sending more information out to parents and guardians in the new year.
