FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

We asked our students what they were most concerned about before coming to GHP. The following were their questions/concerns as well as what they found once they started middle school.

Q: Will the schoolwork be hard?

A: The work is manageable. Teachers know a lot about the subjects they teach which makes it fun. Often it is easy.

Q: I am nervous about being around the grade 7s and 8s. Will I be okay?

A: The older grades were once grade 6s. They remember what is was like and are very nice.

Q: If I have health problems will I be safe?

Q: With students from different schools coming to GHP, am I going to make new friends?

A: YES- People are so nice and everyone is excited to meet new people. It is easy to make new friends.

Q: What if I go to the wrong class or get lost in the halls?

A: I have a homeroom class and will get to tour the school to find my way. If I get lost, there are lots of staff & students to help me.

Q: Am I going to have problems with my locker or forget my combination?

A: My teacher helped our class learn how to use locks and even write down my code for me. By the end of the first week I had the hang of it.

Q: Will I be able to get up and start school so early?

A: Yes, it takes no time at all to adjust to the new schedule.

Q: Am I allowed to use my computer or tablet?

A: Yes I am. Depending on the situation, teachers allow students to use their devices for research, notes and more.

Q: I am in Sports Academy. Do I get to take Complementary Courses?

A: Sigh, unfortunately not BUT I still got Art, Phys Ed & FSL. In Grades 7 & 8, Academy students get 3 options in addition to Academy.

Q: What am I allowed to do at lunch.

A: Students eat in the cafeteria and then get to go out and play on the playground or in the field. I am also able to go home for lunch if I live close by and my parents (guardians) can bring lunch if I forgot OR if they are bringing me a special treat like fast-food.

GHP offers a range of organized athletics including volleyball, basketball, track & field, cross country running, and badminton. Boys and girls are encouraged to try out for any and all sports.

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Complementary Courses for the 2024-2025 school year

Options are a big part of any Junior High allowing students to experience a variety of courses outside of the core curriculum. For the past four years, GHP has gone with a Complementary Course model. In lieu of choice, students experience each of the courses we offer, (Cheer and Hockey students opt for Academy in place of some courses.)

We have heard from students that this exposure to a number of different subjects was fun, engaging and eye-opening. Courses that students may not have chosen in the past were some of their favourites.

Complementary courses run in 3 terms from September to December, December to March and from March to June. Students are placed in option groups with students in their grade and take the same complementary courses as everyone else, (with the exception of Academy.)

NOTE: Hockey & Cheer **Academy** students would not receive the same amount of complementary courses as other students, instead opting to take part in Academy.

- For Grade 6 Academy students, this would mean they would only have Cheer or Hockey Academy.
- For Grade 7 & 8 students, they would take part in Academy as well as three additional complementary courses, (one per term.)

Complementary Course Fees

Please note that many of the courses charge a fee to students that covers material costs such as supplies, ingredients, software, etc. The approved maximum fee for 23-24 courses can be found on our website at https://www.ghp.gsacrd.ab.ca/download/440031 Please note that these fees are subject to change to a maximum of 4% per year.

Fees for each course will appear in RYCOR during the term your child is taking each course.

Students in Grade 6 would experience Physical Education and French as a Second Language as part of their weekly curriculum. On top of that, non-Academy students would take the following courses, (one per term):

- Foods & Fashions
- Art
- Band

Students in Grade 7 & 8 would experience two different complementary courses each term for a total of SIX for non-Academy students.

Bring Your Own Robust Device (BYORD)

Greater St. Albert Catholic Schools encourages students to bring their own device to school. This device should be primarily used as a tool for learning. Students should ensure their device is functioning properly and fully charged each day. The Division recommends a student device that is compatible with Google Workspace for Education and can last for 4-6 hours when fully charged. There are many options available with a variety of features and specifications as well as related costs. Generally, students are most successful using a device with a physical keyboard and a screen size that is 10 inches or larger, connects to WIFI and has an up to date Google Chrome web-browser. Two types of devices that are adequate are listed below:

- 1. Chromebooks (ex. Asus Chromebook, Acer Chromebook, HP Chromebook, Samsung Chromebook)
- 2. Laptop (ex. PC or Mac, such as Macbook Air, Acer Aspire, HP Laptop, Toshiba Laptop, Surface, etc.)

Students who bring their own device to school are responsible to properly secure, store and manage their device. In addition, students must adhere to their school's student code of conduct, as well as the GSACRD's responsible use of technology agreement.
