HOCKEY

- April June: additional excursions that compliment hockey specific dryland training and additional athletic activities (i.e. wall climbing)

CHEER

- 10 month program with 2 training sessions per week.
- Training will be skill development for Cheer athletes
- Includes additional excursions to try different activities (i.e wall climbing)

Lunchtime



Grade 6s & 7s eat in our newly renovated cafeteria. During nicer days, students may also eat outside and if they have parent/guardian permission, starting in

October, they may go to Circle K for a treat. Lunchtime is broken into the eating period and lunch recess. During recess, grade 6s play outside in the field or on the playground. Sports equipment is also available.

Timetable

Students enter the building at 8:00 am. All students are expected to be in their homerooms when announcements begin at 8:10 am. There are 7 blocks each day; two morning blocks followed by a 10 minute Nutrition Break, two classes followed by lunch and three classes before the end of the day at 2:39 pm.

Please note that revision to school schedules can occur from year to year.

Switching Rooms for Classes



Grade 6 students spend the majority of their day in their home classroom. They may move for options and spend Phys. Ed. Class in the gym, the fitness room or outside. Grade 7 & 8 students change classes more often for their various subjects. Students are expected to plan ahead by having the books and supplies needed for each part of the day.

Lockers

Grade 6s & 7s are assigned half lockers outside of their homeroom class. Students are expected to store backpacks, jackets, phones and winter gear in their lockers. Students can access their lockers before school, at lunch and after school. School supplies and books are stored in homeroom classes in desks or bins.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

We asked our students what they were most concerned about before coming to GHP. The following were their questions/concerns as well as what they found once they started middle school.

Q: Will the schoolwork be hard?

A: The work is manageable. Teachers know a lot about the subjects they teach which makes it fun. Often it is easy.

Q: Am I going to have problems with my locker or forget my combination?

A: My teacher helped our class learn how to use locks and even write down my code for me. By the end of the first week I had the hang of it.

Q: Will I be able to get up and start school so early?

A: Yes, it takes no time at all to adjust to the new schedule.

Q: Am I allowed to use my computer or tablet?

A: Yes I am. Depending on the situation, teachers allow students to use their devices for research, notes and more.

Q: I am in Sports Academy. Do I get to take options?

A: In grade 6, Academy takes place during Dynamic options but I still got Art, Phys Ed & FSL. In Grades 7 & 8, Academy students get three options in addition to Academy.

Q: I am a little nervous and embarrassed to change in the changeroom.

A: Nobody is going to judge you since we are all in the same position and if you are still nervous there is a change stall in the room and alternate places to change.
