- Step 3: After you receive the confirmation email, please select the 'click here' option, sign in and add each of your children to your household account.

Cafeteria Cards:

Parents and guardians now have the opportunity to purchase cafeteria cards in denominations of \$10.00 and \$20.00 for their child/ren.

- Cards will be handed out in the Office
- Student will put their name on them. In the event it goes missing and is turned into the office, there may be an opportunity to reunite the card to the rightful owner.
- Student will sign that they received them
- If bought on line the Student must bring in the School Cash Receipt to receive their cards

• Please be aware that the school is NOT responsible for lost cards they will not be replaced. Students are encouraged to treat these cards as if they are cash

These cards may only be used for cafeteria purchases and not for kapow pops or other sales in the school.

Effective Communication Skills

As part of the counseling program, I am offering the opportunity for students to meet in small groups. The purpose of these groups is to allow the students to acquire information and skills that will help them become more successful in the school and home setting. School success depends not only on academic ability, but on self confidence and social adjustment.

Your child has an opportunity to participate in a group called, "Effective Communication Skills". This group is designed to help students recognize that our feelings, thoughts, and behaviors are connected in order to provide skills to address thinking patterns (feelings) around tasks or events. Students will develop skills to recognize how they might be feeling and how to communicate more successfully or to behavior in a more helpful manner when feeling nervous, worried, or negative about a task or event.

- Topics to be covered;
- -Feelings and boundaries
- -I feel statements
- -Pushing away behaviors
- -Drawing near behaviors
- -Anger Management Skills
- -Little, Medium, and Big Problems = matching your actions

Each of the 8 group meetings will be approximately 35 minutes long. The meetings will be held on Wednesdays beginning in February.

PowerSchool – An Important Communication Tool

Have you checked your child's PowerSchool report lately? This tracking system provides communication between home and school. Check your child's attendance and marks with a couple easy clicks. All students have been taught how to log on and check their marks. All students are required to have their agendas with them all day, everyday. Teachers and parents can write notes back and forth, and parents can see if their child is arriving late as they are stamped at the office as they come in. (If lost, students must replace them at a cost of \$9.00). If you do write a note to the teacher, please ask your child to show the agenda to the teacher. In the event a student does not arrive to school and the parents have advised us that their child should be there, we initiate our emergency protocol to locate the missing child. It takes valuable office time to phone home to check whether or not your child is sick at home. We require that all parents call the school if their child will be absent. Messages may be left on the answering machine. Thank you for your assistance!
